Dear Parents and Carers,

Unbelievably, we are now a third of the way through this half-term and once again, it has felt like a very busy week at the college. The Spring Term can often feel like it is moving very quickly and this one is no exception.

As we look back at this week, our Year 10s started their practice exams as they are now mid-way through their GCSE programs of study. I am delighted our students have applied themselves diligently to these and will continue to do so, I am sure, next week. For our Year 10 students and teachers, these exams are a really useful benchmark on the progress that has been made thus far and the next steps required for their learning journey, before reaching their GCSE exams in Year 11.

On Wednesday and Thursday, we held our Year 11 parents evenings and I have had some really useful and positive exchanges with parents about next steps for students in this year group. This is important so we can work together as one community to do as much as we can to preserve the investment made by the Trust in the buildings over the summer.
